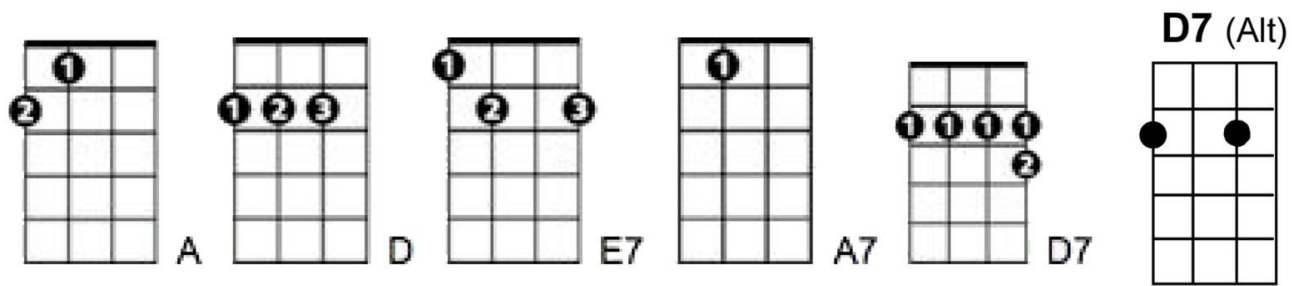


Blue Moon of Kentucky by Bill Monroe
