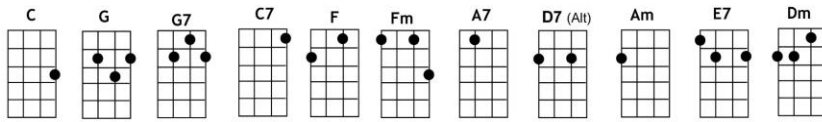


When I'm Sixty-Four (Beatles)
