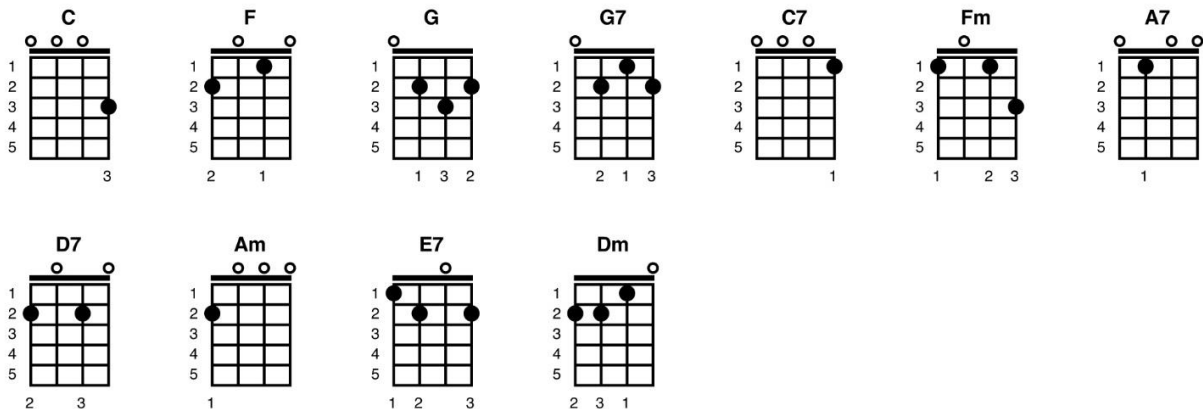
Key of C

N.C. = No Chord, vocal only; parens for (C) mean strum once.

In two places chord Am is doubled up to show one silent measure.

Tiny tweak to 7th chord on "feed me" makes transposition easier.

D7 When I'm G7 sixty-C four GC?

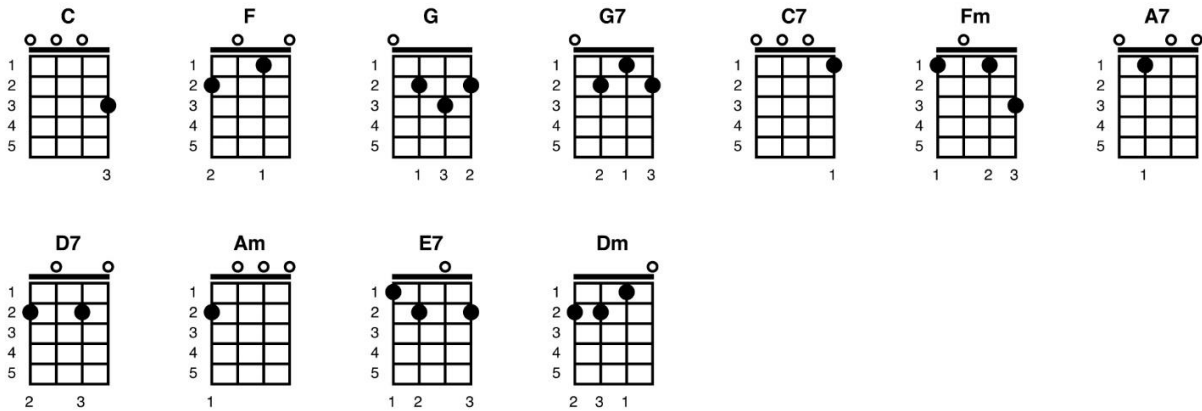
